

Valdosta Boys' Soccer Rules and Expectations

Mission Statement: Valdosta Soccer is committed to providing a challenging and enjoyable environment for our student-athletes to reach their athletic and academic goals. With the goal of developing great athletes and great students, we strive to provide the highest level of soccer training possible and a high level of expectations for academic achievement.

- This program has a high standard for academic achievement. Players are required to download the student app for Infinite Campus on their phones (if a student does not have a phone, they will use an academic folder). Players are expected to check their grades and know their progress in their classes.
- Since academics are important, the team has different levels of probation for grades:
 - **Probation Level One:** Players with an average lower than an 80 in any class will have extra 110s to run during conditioning days.
 - **Probation Level Two:** Players failing a class will have extra 110s to run during conditioning and playing time will be cut.
 - **Probation Level Three:** Players failing two or more classes will be allowed to practice and will run 110s after practice but will have to sit out from game.
- This program also has high standards for behavior. Players are required to share my extension and email with every teacher. My extension is **5315**, and my email is **roberto.carrillo@gocats.org**. This allows teachers to contact me if any behavior issues arise. Behavior issues will result in disciplinary action which will vary depending on severity.
- Players are expected to be at every practice during the season. Failure to come to practice without notifying your coach and receiving approval may result in playing time being cut and/or extra conditioning the following practice.
- Players are expected to be **coachable**. Players must be coachable to grow, learn, improve, and excel.
